
agree that for the construction industry to thrive and grow, it needs a diverse, equitable, and inclusive workforce.


63%

^{*} These are the findings of a survey conducted by the Canadian Association of Women in Construction from February 23 to 27, 2024 among a representative sample of 1,505 online Canadians who are members of the Angus Reid Forum. The survey was conducted in English and French. For comparison purposes only, a probability sample of this size would carry a margin of error of +/-2.5 percentage points, 19 times out of 20.
